Industry & Partner Updates:

Nadia:

- Working on multiple projects including a Carbon Modeling project
- Intensification of data collection; have doubled sample lots
- Industry needs more people working in the field of data collection
- Having more established plots would help the forestry program overall and help students build important skills related to reports, projects, and long-term analyses

Richard:

- Data Collection field could be appealing to students wishing to take a gap year; travel, gain more interest into the field

Diane:

- The Forestry Challenge had an outstanding Fall session with 538 students attending
- They are hoping to expand to urban areas through an Urban Forestry Grant

Christina:

- UNR has been focused on Workforce Development with Nevada's High Schools
- Currently offer 3-year vocational Fire Science Program allowing students to graduate high school and immediately enter the fire and land management workforce fields

Program Review and Updates:

Brad:

- Reviewed Forestry and Environmental Science and Technology Annual Program Reviews
- The EVS APR shows significant lower course success rates among LatinX students
- LTCC recently secured the Good Jobs Challenge; supports both Forestry and Fire programs

Adrian:

- The Forestry program served 178 students in 2022-23; awarding 25 certificates and 2 associate degrees
- Having instructors that are also currently working in different areas of the field has shown to be very beneficial to students
- LTCC has had great success with partnerships, and they have been mutually beneficial in building pathways
